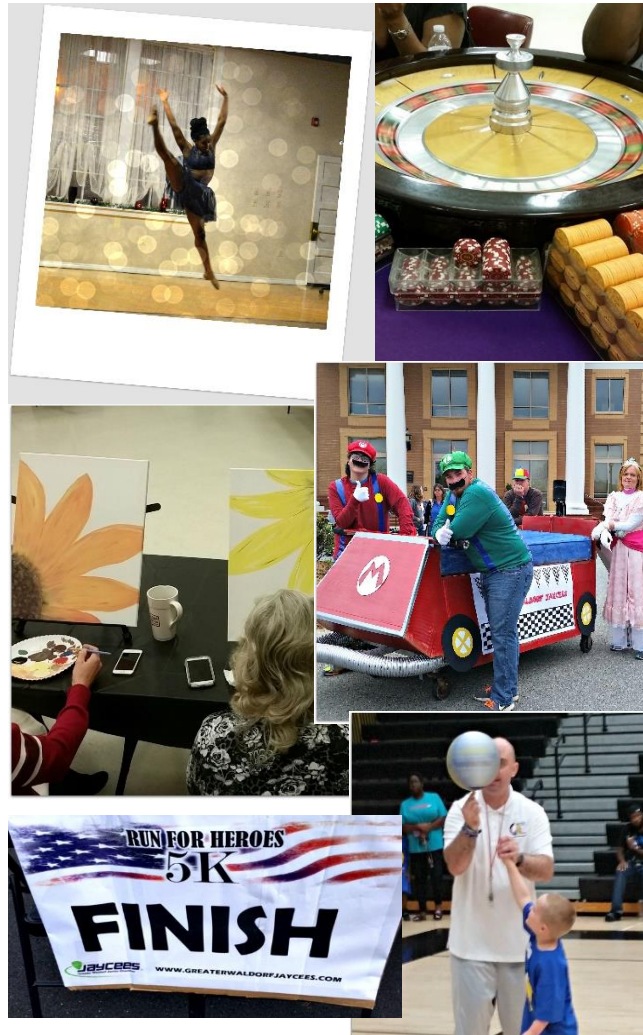

Painting for a Purpose
